

What is a breast biopsy?

A breast biopsy is a minimally invasive procedure to remove a small sample of breast tissue for laboratory testing. Breast biopsy is considered the best way to evaluate a suspicious area in your breast to determine if it is breast cancer.

There are several types of breast biopsy procedures. Your physician and our Breast Specialist Dr. David Green will discuss with you which procedure is best for your diagnosis.





Types of breast biopsy

Stereotactic Breast Biopsy:

A state-of-the-art digital technique that uses mammography to pinpoint the precise area of breast tissue for sample removal.

Ultrasound Breast Biopsy:

Biopsy technique using ultrasound guidance to locate the area for breast tissue sampling.

Both methods are minimally invasive and give minimal discomfort.

Who will perform my breast biopsy?

Our Clinical Director, **Dr. David Green**, is a Breast Specialist and Consultant Radiologist with over 22 years experience.

Dr. Green has reported over 250,000 breast examinations and has performed over 10,000 image guided breast biopsies, lymph node biopsies and wire localizations.

major breast facility in the UK, Dr. Green gained extensive experience and expertise in managing and leading a large screening facility, and his expertise is helping Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre to pursue their goal of achieving international recognized standards and performance. Dr. Green is a fellow of the Royal College of Radiologists (UK) and a member of the British Society of Breast Radiology (BSBR).

Throughout his career Dr. Green has participated in the UK National Quality Standards (NQS) program in which his personal performance in detecting breast cancer was audited against national standards. Dr. Green has consistently exceeded the national standards in cancer detection whilst maintaining a low recall rate, which ensured patients did not have unnecessary repeat mammograms and breast biopsies.

A pathologist is a doctor who diagnoses and characterizes disease, by examining biopsy samples or bodily fluids to determine if they are benign or cancerous.
