

The year of 2016 was one of monumental achievement for Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre.

After a year of planning for the Centre's new Radiation Therapy unit, in 2015, early in 2016 the Centre entered into two important clinical agreements with the Dana Farber / Brigham and Women's Cancer Center (the "DF/BWCC") and the Bermuda Hospitals Board (the "BHB").

The Pre-Opening Services Agreement with the DF/BWCC was one in which this world class cancer care and research center entered into a clinical affiliation with Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre to develop, design and oversee the project management for the new unit. On July 13, 2016 ground was broken at 46 Point Finger Road and the ten-month long construction project began.

The second contract was a Collaboration Agreement with the BHB for the provision of CT simulation studies for patients who are referred for Radiation Therapy as part of their cancer treatment, and for the shared services of Clinical Oncologist and Medical Director, Dr. Chris Fosker. The agreement with the BHB negates the need for adding another CT scanner to the Island and ultimately will result in optimization of the utilization of diagnostic imaging equipment. As a Clinical Oncologist, Dr. Fosker is trained in both Radiation and Medical Oncology which will greatly benefit patients who may be referred for both types of treatment.

The Radiation Therapy initiative has been extremely well supported by the local community, health insurance providers, the government of Bermuda, corporate and local company donors, and by the board of directors and Centre staff. The project remains on target and on budget for a mid-2017 opening.

Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre had a successful 2016 fundraising year with the 3rd annual Relay For Life of Bermuda event, which raised \$650,000. The Centre also celebrated the 20th anniversary of October Breast Cancer Awareness month, with sponsor BF&M. Other successful events throughout the year included World Cancer Day, St. Baldrick's, the Centre's Annual Travel Raffle, Fish Fry, Girls Night In, Pink Denim Day, Movember, XL-Catlin Man on the Run, Men's Health Event and Christmas Seals. The funds raised throughout 2016 were allocated towards the Radiation Therapy initiative and to continue to support the Centre's Equal Access Fund to provide access to care for those in our community who may not have health insurance which covers the services we provide.

It would not be possible to carry out the Centre's mission without the amazing support of so many people across Bermuda. On behalf of the Board of Directors, I want to give a heartfelt thank you to our donors and volunteers. I am pleased to present this annual report for Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre, together with the five year financial summary.

REVIEW

2016 was another successful year for Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre.

The Centre conducted 10,930 diagnostic imaging and cancer detection appointments during the year, including 106 breast and prostate cancer biopsies. The Centre's diagnostic imaging referrals have been most significantly impacted by a reduction in recommendations for Dual Energy X-Ray Absorptiometry (DEXA) studies which are used to evaluate an individual's bone mineral density and potential risk for developing osteoporosis and/or osteopenia.

In 2016 the Centre continued to focus on expense reduction for operations while ensuring donated funds were used to strengthen education and awareness programmes, such as cancer prevention programmes SunSmart and LungSmart, as well as other Centre initiatives. Education and fundraising events are key to the Centre's ability to provide donated diagnostic and cancer detection services as well as providing funding for education programmes and the Radiation Therapy Initiative. The Charity was extremely well supported throughout the year for the various events held by the Centre. As indicated in the audited financial summary presented in this report, the Centre realized a modest net income of \$23,293 for 2016.

Significant progress was made on the Centre's Radiation Therapy Initiative with the completion of the new facility design in the first quarter of 2016 and ground breaking in mid-July. The Centre entered into a contract agreement with Varian Systems in August, for the purchase of the latest technology in radiation treatment, which is the Truebeam Linear Accelerator (LINAC).

This system is capable of treating 95% of all types of cancers which would benefit from radiation therapy as part of their treatment plan or for management of symptoms or pain.

In the fall of 2016 the Centre initiated recruitment for the specialized staff that will be required to operate the new Radiation Therapy facility. Eight new staff members will join the Centre's team of 17 current staff members. Of the 25 Centre Staff members, 18 will directly support the clinical services provided at the Centre, which includes; digital mammography, ultrasound, DEXA, breast biopsies, prostate biopsies and radiation therapy. The remaining team members support education and awareness, accounts, fundraising and communications, and events.

The work conducted annually in achieving the mission and vision of the Centre is only possible as a result of the unwavering dedication and commitment of the staff, volunteers, donors and our volunteer Board of Directors. On behalf of the Centre I wish to thank the community which has supported the charity for the past 71 years.

RADIATION THERAPY

THE NEED FOR RADIATION IN BERMUDA

Radiation therapy is one of the pillars of cancer treatment and an essential component of a comprehensive cancer care pathway. It is recommended for 60-70% of cancer patients and over half of newly diagnosed cases. It has been clearly demonstrated that due to a multitude of factors some people in Bermuda with cancer do not receive optimal care. Without a local radiation therapy centre, residents of Bermuda miss out on receiving radiation with the love and support of their family and comfort of their normal surroundings, or worst of all, some people miss out on radiation therapy completely.



2014

An analysis was completed indicating a clear need for radiation therapy in Bermuda and from a cost perspective, it now was an affordable option for the island.



2015

A Memorandum of Understanding was signed with Dana-Farber and Brigham and Women's Hospital which solidified them as a partner with the radiation therapy centre.



2016

Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre hold a ground breaking ceremony and start the construction on Bermuda's first radiation therapy centre.

NEW COLLABORATIONS

Bermuda Hospitals Board

The start of 2016 saw the implementation of the collaborative agreement between Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre and The Bermuda Hospitals Board. This allowed Dr. Fosker to split his time between the King Edward VII Memorial Hospital (KEMH) and Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre, taking up the position of Medical Director and Clinical Oncologist at Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre.

Varian Truebeam

Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre purchased the Truebeam Linear Accelerator (LINAC) which will bring leading edge cancer care to patients in Bermuda. As one the world's most advanced radiation therapy machines, it has the capability of treating up to 95% of all patients who will benefit from radiation therapy.



THE FUTURE

AT THE CLOSE OF 2016 THE PROJECT REMAINED ON TARGET AND BUDGET TO DELIVER RADIATION THERAPY FOR THE FIRST TIME IN BERMUDA BY MID-2017

HOW FAR WE HAVE COME

The need and benefit of having radiation therapy available for patients here in Bermuda has long been known within the medical community. There were apparent attempts to develop a service in the 60s. In 1997 when Professor Sid Lowry finished his distinguished career as an oncologist, he stated one of his few regrets was not being able to implement a radiation therapy treatment service here in Bermuda. However, it was only when Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre took up the initiative that this clear need for Bermuda had a chance of going from a hope to becoming a reality.

In 2016, this ambitious project to provide radiation therapy in Bermuda became tangible. After the great steps forward in 2015, this year saw the project leap from a desire to help cancer patients to architects drawings, to a very busy and well run building site. Following the collaboration agreement signed between Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre and the Dana Farber and Brigham and Women's Cancer Center, in late 2015, the first quarter of 2016 was filled with an intense period of work by all parties to complete the design of the proposed facility. With Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre's experience and understanding of the needs for Bermuda and the expertise of the world's leading specialists from Boston, the facility design process was able to keep the central focus on the patient.

OUR TEAM EXPANDS

While the construction was in full swing, the last quarter of 2016 was dedicated to recruiting an expert team to work at Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre to make sure the delivery of care for patients receiving radiation is of the highest standard. After an extensive search and an interview process that included interviews by multiple members of the Dana-Farber and Brigham and Women's Cancer Center, Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre has recruited a highly qualified medical physicist, an exceptionally and diversely experienced radiation nurse and a wonderful team of radiation therapists (including a returning Bermudian).

Relay For Life of Bermuda 2016 was the third annual Global Relay event for Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre. It was another successful year with significant growth seen in funds raised. Thousands of people participated throughout the 24 hours supporting each team's fundraising initiatives. With the Radiation Therapy Centre ground breaking in mid-2016, the mission of Relay became reality.

BF&M BREAST CANCER AWARENESS WALK





2016 was the 20th Anniversary of the BF&M Breast Cancer Awareness Walk. When the weather forecast called for rain and high winds, BF&M and Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre persevered with a record number of people showing up making the walk the most successful event to date. With the theme being "In it to End It" almost 1800 walkers participated in support. Women, men and children of all ages walked together to celebrate the lives affected by breast cancer which is a disease that affects 1 in 8 women. The BF&M Breast Cancer Awareness Walk is a powerful and inspiring opportunity to unite as a community to honor breast cancer survivors, raise awareness, and raise money to help Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre achieve its mission.





GIRLS NIGHT IN

This year, 17 "Girls Night In" events were hosted by women across the island. It's not only an opportunity to get together with friends and supporters, but a chance to raise money for a worthy cause. Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre is once again pleased to congratulate the Bosom Buddies for raising an incredible total of \$85,187 during their 11th Annual "Girls Night In" fundraiser. The total amount raised by all the groups this year was \$96,501. A huge thank you to all those women who participated this year.

WEAR IT PINK DENIM DAY

Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre's annual Denim Day event is unique in that participants are encouraged to not just wear denim, but to wear pink! Businesses, organizations and schools across Bermuda participate and, for one day, allow employees and students to wear denim and/or pink to help raise funds for Breast Cancer Awareness month. A sticker is given in exchange for a suggested \$5 donation. \$27,979 was raised this year.

ANNUAL RAFFLE

Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre's annual raffle is a favorite for the residents of Bermuda with the main prize being a \$10,000 travel certificate. With the generosity of local donations from stores and support from volunteers, Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre raised \$59,910 toward Radiation Therapy.

FISH FRY

The Annual Fish Fry hosted by the Social Committee at Christ Church in Warwick and Keith's Kitchen, is run entirely by volunteers in support of Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Patrons can drive through and pick up their fish dinners or stay and enjoy a family fun filled evening at the church hall. Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre is very appreciative for everyone who helped raise \$5,272.

FUNDS RAISED

All funds raised during the month of October, support our charitable outreach initiatives which include our Radiation Therapy Initiative, Equal Access Fund, along with our Education and Awareness Programmes.

BOSOM BUDDIES GIRLS NIGHT IN 2016

Thank you to Chrissy, June, Amy and Hannah, along with all the other Bosom Buddies, volunteers, and sponsors who helped make their 2016 Girls Night In event the success it was. This year they raised **\$85,187** for Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre's Radiation Therapy Initiative and Equal Access Fund. Over the past 11 years, these amazing ladies have raised **\$322,698** to support Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre's Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Thank you for all of your hard work!



\$75,693 MEN'S HEALTH MONTH

The purpose of Men's Health Month in Bermuda, is to heighten the awareness of preventable health problems and encourage early detection and treatment of disease in men. In 2016, the month of November gave health care providers, the media and individuals an opportunity to encourage men and boys to seek medical advice and early detection for disease. The response was overwhelming this year with MOvember and XL Catlin Man on the Run which are events that fund men's health programmes which are provided annually by Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre.

MOVEMBER - \$50,739

This year marks the sixth Annual Movember at Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre. In 2016, Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre partnered with the Robin Hood Football Club as the Movember ambassadors to gain more awareness for men's health during the month. The trophy awarded to the top corporate fundraising team went to HSBC finance and the non-corporate fundraising team was Robin Hood Football Club. With the support of our sponsors, Robin Hood Pub and Restaurant, Gillette, and The Cutting Room, our MoBros, MoSistas, and MoTeams we were able to raise \$50,739 to help bring radiation therapy to Bermuda and raise awareness for men's health. This month long event encourages men to take an active role in their health.

XL CATLIN MAN ON THE RUN - \$24.954

The XL Catlin Man on the Run aims to raise funds for the awareness of men's health issues, specifically prostate and testicular cancer. Funds raised by this event support Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre's men's health programmes, providing uninsured and underinsured men in our community financial assistance to recieve health check ups, cancer detection tests such as prostate biopsies and treatments. Funds raised this year supported Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre's Radiation Therapy Initiative. This year \$24,954 was raised through this incredible initiative sponsored by XL Catlin.











The funds raised through MOvember and XL Catlin Man on the Run supported the radiation therapy initiative along with two other programmes in 2016:

FREE MEN'S HEALTH SCREENINGS

This year, Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre had almost 200 men attend the 5th Annual Free Men's Health Screening event. The premise of the one day event, is to provide health services to all men in Bermuda who are normally unable to afford them. Thanks to the support of Government Health Departments, numerous charities, private physicians and corporate sponsors, men had access to the following:

Blood Pressure Body Composition

Blood Glucose Nutrition
Skin Analysis Foot Exam
Lung Function Protein Testing

Dental Screening Physician Consultation

DOCTOR VOUCHER PROGRAMME

There are no free health clinics on island for men, leaving a void that needed to be filled in the community. This year, Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre continued to offer the doctor voucher programme to men who are uninsured/ under-insured and unable to afford a doctors visit. The voucher allows these men access to physician's island wide with \$150 of the cost being subsidized by Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre. In 2015/2016, the programme was an incredible success as close to 200 men were able to visit their doctor when they wouldn't have otherwise been able to. The vouchers were given out at the Men's Health Screening event and as per request by the individual.









\$48,000 DONATED ST. BALDRICK'S

Since 2005, the St. Baldrick's Foundation has funded more than \$178 million in research grants to find a cure for childhood cancers. In Bermuda, a number of organisations and individuals came together to shave for the cause that supports childhood cancer research. The St. Baldrick's Foundation kicked off its 10th annual head shaving event at Saltus Grammar School where more than 110 students, staff, and relatives participated in the event. Saltus participants raised close to \$250,000. The Docksiders event also raised over \$186,000. Warwick Academy held their second annual, raising almost \$60,000, and Mount St. Agnes held their first annual even, raising over \$27,000.

The events raised money for children's cancer research overseas, with \$48,000 of the funds being allocated to Bermuda Cancer and Health's SunSmart programme, a school and summer camp based programme teaching sun protective behaviours. Non-profit hairpiece maker, Locks of Love, also benefitted as several students, relatives, and teachers donated their hair to provide hair pieces for children with long-term medically related hair loss.








WORLD CANCER DAY 100 SECONDS OF SILENCE











World Cancer Day is recognized every year on February 4th. The theme for 2016 was "We can. I can" which explores how everyone, as a collective or as individuals, can do their part to reduce the global burden of cancer. Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre, partnered with PALS, Friends of Hospice and The Bermuda Hospitals Board to spread the message. The goal of the day was to reach and impact as many people in Bermuda by encouraging them to join us in 100 seconds of silence at noon, both in offices and homes, to honor the 100 people that were lost in 2014 to cancer. As a tight knit community, everyone has been affected by cancer, whether it being themselves, a friend or a family member. Just by making lifestyle changes like not smoking, eating healthy and exercising, we can all can decrease our chance of getting cancer by 45%.

EDUCATION & AWARENESS

SUNSMART PROGRAMME

SUNSMART MISSION

To Increase the awareness of Bermuda's youth about the importance of practicing SunSmart behaviours in order to reduce their risk of developing skin cancer in their lifetime.

UV INDEX MONITORING

July 2014, marked the official launch of the UV Index monitoring by the Bermuda Weather Service (BWS). The SunSmart programme played a significant role in education and public awareness of this important surveilance. In 2015, Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre assisted BWS in obtaining its very own UV Radiometer. Bermuda now has accurate recordings of the UV Index in real time that is available to the public to view on the BWS website. A Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the two parties was signed in 2016, in order for us to continue to work closely with BWS to provide consistent up to date UV Index readings and awareness to the general public.

FUNDING

The SunSmart Programme is funded by the St. Baldrick's Foundation with a generous \$48,000 donation every year. Due to this funding, Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre is able to reach the thousands of students, to educate them on skin protection and recognise potentially dangerous changes in their skin.

ABOUT THE SUNSMART PROGRAMME

Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre is Bermuda's leading advocate in working towards nationally accepted sun protection policies within our schools, clubs, camps and workplaces. As the only organisation on the island dedicated to providing sun safety awareness and education for the community, the programme is incredibly important. Our popular Slip! Slap! Slop! Seek! Slide! campaign is successfully helping to reduce sun exposure and teaching children to protect themselves against an increased risk of skin cancer. On average, the programme is delivered to 40-50 preschools and primary schools island wide each year, as well as a number of middle schools and high schools.



SUNSMART SUMMER CAMP ACCREDITATION

Introduced in 2010, Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre's summer camp accreditation programme remains in high demand. Participating camps receive free sunscreen and bucket hats for their campers. Camps that complete the accredited programme and fulfill all requirements are awarded accreditation by Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre for documented and observed sun safety measures at their individual camps.

AMERICA'S CUP ENDEAVOUR PROGRAM

This year marks the second year of Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre's partnership with The America's Cup Endeavour Program which is a youth sailing and education program for children aged 9-12. Over the next year, Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre will provide weekly presentations, hats and sunscreen, with the potential of the youth program continuing beyond the America's Cup Series.

LUNGSMART PROGRAMME

LungSmart, is a school based programme aimed at reducing the number of school aged children who begin smoking (as measured by the Bermuda National School Survey), and to encourage those who already smoke to become tobacco-free. In 2016, a total of 15 Middle Schools and 20 Primary Schools were visited and the programme was delivered to 366 students. The LungSmart programme uses a variety of interactive methods including PowerPoint presentations, "Hands on" examination of real pig's lungs, and Role Play to educate students on the many health dangers associated with smoking including persons exposed to second-hand smoke.



LECTURE AND PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS

Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre supports the community by participating in Health Fairs and organizing Wellness talks to corporate, government, civic, church and school PTA groups. Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre Staff attended a total of 9 Health Fairs and gave 11 Wellness talks during the year. In 2016, there were 4 free public lectures, two were on the HPV epidemic for Cervical Cancer month, one for Melanoma month on Skin Cancer and the other for Breast Cancer Awareness month on Breast Reconstruction. We continue to offer free public presentations and corporate lunch and learns promoting the message that many cancers are preventable, treatable and beatable.



At Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre, we are committed to our mission of early detection, prevention and support. We offer a full range of clinical services provided by our dedicated and highly trained staff.

DIGITAL MAMMOGRAPHY DENSITOMETRY

Digital Mammography remains the gold standard for breast cancer screening and Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre is pleased to offer this state-of-the-art service. Both screening and diagnostic mammograms are offered. Female patients, over the age of 40 years or those with a family history of breast cancer, are encouraged to speak to their doctor about the best screening protocol for them.

BONE

Bone density testing is used to assess the strength of the bones and the probability of a fracture in persons at risk for osteoporosis. The bone mineral density scan is a non-invasive procedure that takes just a few minutes. Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre offers one of the most accurate bone density tests available and assists in the diagnosis of bone mineral loss at an early stage.

BREAST BIOPSIES

A breast biopsy is a minimally invasive procedure to remove a small sample of breast tissue for laboratory testing. This on site procedure is designed to reduce the amount of time and anxiety experienced from the moment a potential breast abnormality is detected. Each patient will receive personal and confidential service from our dedicated team of professionals.

PROSTATE BIOPSIES

A prostate biopsy is a procedure in which prostate gland tissue samples are removed with a special biopsy needle to determine if cancer or other abnormal cells are present. This procedure is conducted in our dedicated ultrasound suite.

ULTRASOUND

Ultrasound is a diagnostic tool which is used to assist in the detection of cancer. We offer a full range of ultrasound services such as breast, gynecological, abdominal, testicular, prostate and soft tissue in our Mary-Jean Mitchell Green Ultrasound Suite. Ultrasound guided breast and prostate biopsies are provided also.

BREAST IMAGING CENTRE OF EXCELLENCE

Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre, in 2013, earned the Breast Imaging Centre of Excellence designation from the American College of Radiology (ACR). Since 1987, the ACR has accredited more than 35,000 facilities in 10 imaging modalities. Through the ACR, Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre has earned accreditation in mammography, stereotactic breast biopsy, and breast ultrasound (including ultrasound-guided breast biopsy). Centres designated as an ACR Breast Imaging Centre of Excellence have:

- · Voluntarily gone through a rigorous review process to be sure they meet nationally accepted standards
- Employed personnel who are well qualified, through education and certification, to perform and interpret medical images and administer radiation therapy treatments
- · Acquired equipment appropriate for the testing or treatment of breast cancer
- · Met or exceeded quality assurance and safety guidelines


