Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre ("the Centre; BCHC") continued to grow from strength to strength during the year under review. We are proud to state that we are the only not-for-profit cancer screening, detection and treatment facility providing testing and treatment to all who come through our doors regardless of ability to pay.

The Centre delivers high quality diagnostic imaging and radiation therapy treatment for everyone in Bermuda who requires our services. We continue to work closely with the community to improve the health and well-being of all residents in Bermuda via our various cancer prevention programmes.

During 2018 we further strengthened our management and clinical teams, as the Centre had a rapid period of growth with the introduction of radiation therapy in 2017. We now have 28 dedicated staff and very strong management and clinical leadership teams in place. Our affiliation with Dana-Farber/Brigham & Women's Cancer Center is working very well with our local radiation clinical team having access to the top cancer specialists in the United States. By so doing, we can ensure residents who require radiation treatment receive first class quality care at home.

During 2018, the Centre provided approximately \$1.16 million of services to the uninsured and underinsured population; a substantial commitment for the Centre. Thankfully, through our various successful fund-raising

events such as Relay for Life, Breast Cancer month activities etc. and the ongoing support of our corporate sponsors and community, we have been successful in raising the funds needed to ensure we meet our commitment to Bermuda.

On behalf of the Board, I wish to extend sincere congratulations to the entire team of the Centre on achieving both the Bermuda National Standards Certification (BNSC) and the American College of Radiology Accreditation in radiation oncology during 2018. The latter accreditation is the first provided to a Centre outside of the USA. Thanks to the effort and dedication of our staff and Board, the past year has seen tremendous progress.

We welcomed Mrs. Lynne Woolridge as Chief Executive Officer of BCHC in June of 2018. Lynne has strong management and leadership experience and has provided excellent guidance and direction to the Centre since joining us. We will have many future challenges such as health care reform and ensuring we meet the future cancer needs of the Island; however, the Board is confident that we have strong management and clinical teams in place to meet future challenges.

Our heartfelt thanks and appreciation to all of our staff and to everyone in Bermuda who has provided us with their continued support.

## Lynne Woolridge, Chief Executive Officer WELCOME TO OUR NOT-FOR-PROFIT

In 2018, Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre ("the Centre") saw a strengthening of its operational governance, with the addition of a new Chief Executive Officer and Chief Financial Officer to compliment the Marketing and Compliance Officers within the senior management team. All staff, clinical and administrative, are committed to delivering on our mission of education, prevention, detection, treatment and support.

The Centre's Diagnostic Imaging team of technologists conducted over 11,000 patient appointments during 2018, comprising 3-D mammograms, ultrasound, bone density assessment and prostate biopsies. After a three year absence, a new Clinical Director was successfully recruited, enabling the Centre to interpret scans faster and to carry out breast biopsies.

In May of 2018, the Centre celebrated the one-year opening of the Radiation Therapy unit. By that date, more than 120 patients had been treated at the facility, and the numbers grew to 222 by year-end. The same world-class comprehensive cancer care found in big cities is available right here at home. Patients can receive treatment surrounded by their family and friends as they continue to lead their daily lives. Our partnership with Dana-Farber/Brigham and Women's Cancer Center (DF/BWCC) and Bermuda Hospitals Board (BHB) are vital to enable us to make on-island radiation treatment a reality for the community.

The Centre strives to meet and exceed international standards, and during 2018, we were able to celebrate two accomplishments. The Centre earned Bermuda National Standards Committee





(BNSC) re-certification, while the Radiation
Therapy unit earned American College of
Radiology (ACR) accreditation, the very first
international radiation oncology facility to do so.
We are honoured to have been recognised for
delivering services at the highest level of quality
and patient safety.

The Centre believes that everyone should have access to potentially life-saving early cancer screening and treatment. Through the generosity

of those in our community, we can provide services free of co-pay, regardless of health insurance status. As we are seeing an increase in the number of uninsured and underinsured persons within the community, it is critical that our Equal Access Fund is sufficient to subsidise services for this vulnerable population. Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre is incredibly grateful to the community of staff, volunteers, donors, and its Board of Directors who support us in delivering our mission.

# Achievements in 2018

### EQUAL ACCESS PROGRAMME

The Centre believes that everyone should have access to health care. Cancer is costly. It can take a toll on one's health, emotions, time, relationships – and wallet. There are unexpected charges, and even the best health insurance doesn't cover 100% of the costs.

As a registered charity and to honour our mission of providing care for all, the Centre does not charge a co-pay for diagnostic imaging services or radiation therapy treatment. Where possible, the Centre receives reimbursements from health insurance, which helps to cover some of the costs.

However, not all services are covered 100%, and approximately 20% of our patients either do not have health insurance or only have basic coverage. This is where the Equal Access fund helps to subsidise the cost of services provided at our Centre. This fund is developed through the support of the Centre's fundraising activities, donations towards the clinical services received at the Centre or by making a contribution directly to the charity – each gift makes it possible for the Centre to provide equal access to early detection and cancer treatment for everyone in our community.

### **ACCREDITATION IN RADIATION ONCOLOGY**

After just eighteen (18) months of operation, our radiation therapy unit earned accreditation in radiation oncology by the American College of Radiology (ACR), making the Centre the first international facility to achieve this recognition. ACR accreditation is a voluntary process that demonstrates Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre's commitment to excellence in patient care and safety.

The ACR seal of accreditation represents the highest level of quality and patient safety. It is awarded only to facilities meeting specific Practice Guidelines and Technical Standards

developed by ACR after a peer-review evaluation by board-certified radiation oncologists and medical physicists who are experts in the field.

Patient care and treatment, patient safety, personnel qualifications, adequacy of facility equipment, quality control procedures, and quality assurance programmes are assessed.

The findings were reported to the ACR Committee on Radiation Oncology Accreditation, which subsequently provided our Centre with a comprehensive report which is used for continuous practice improvement.

### **ENSURING BEST BUSINESS PRACTICE**

Always striving to meet and exceed international standards, the Centre successfully earned the Bermuda National Standards Committee (BNSC) Certification for a second time, after first earning this achievement in 2014. The BNSC certification programme demonstrates a high level of operational and programmatic management.

The Senior Management team and Board of Directors felt that embarking on the BNSC Certification process was vital to ensure that we were operating at the highest standards. With a new management team in place and expanding services, it's important to demonstrate our ongoing commitment to excellence.


The purpose of the BNSC certification is to help charities and other private organisations that are seeking government and community funds to demonstrate through compliance with a set of internationally recognised standards of practice that they are operating effectively and efficiently.

# About DIAGNOSTIC IMAGING

Diagnostic imaging is a crucial tool to identify cancers in the earliest stages.

During 2018, the Diagnostic Imaging department provided over 11,000 clinical appointments. Digital mammograms, the gold standard for the early detection of breast cancer, constituted the bulk of the appointments, and the number of 3D-Tomo mammograms, suitable for those with dense breast tissue, increased. We continued to offer Bone Densitometry screening, for early diagnosis of osteoporosis, plus Ultrasound and breast and prostate Biopsy services.

To strengthen the team, we secured the services of not only a new mammography technologist but also a new Clinical Director. The Centre has been without the services of a Clinical Director for the last three years, and thus we are pleased to welcome Dr Olivia Bato in 2019. She will meet directly with diagnostic and biopsy patients and then provide timely reporting to referring physicians.

# Radiation Therapy

As an American College of Radiology radiation oncology accredited facility, the unit adheres to strict standards that demonstrate our commitment to providing high quality, patient-centred care.



The radiation team continued to work to enhance the quality of radiation treatment and how the care is delivered, both in the advanced technology used and in the personalised patient care provided.

Every Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre patient in need of radiation therapy receives care based on an individualised treatment plan developed in close collaboration with specialists at Dana-Farber/Brigham and Women's Cancer Center (DF/BWCC) in Boston.

Within DF/BWCC, there are 12 specialised cancer treatment centres, with experts in every type of cancer. Through the Centre's clinical affiliation with DF/BWCC, patients receiving their individualised radiation therapy treatments can be confident that they have access to this expertise without leaving Bermuda.





### COMMUNITY HEALTH

Statistics indicate that one in three people will develop cancer in their lifetime.

While science continues to improve diagnosis and treatment, people do not have to wait for the scientific breakthroughs. Individuals can take control of everyday life habits and start protecting themselves today. The Centre continues to shift focus from "you have cancer and here is what to expect" towards prevention, reducing one's cancer risk and encouraging early detection and diagnosis. Many cancers are preventable through healthy lifestyle choices and medical screenings, and through early detection when treatment is more likely to be successful.

### In 2018 SunSmart delivered 85 school presentations, 34 summer camp programmes.

Skin cancer is almost entirely preventable. The ultimate goal of the SunSmart Programme is to prevent the dangerous outcomes of sun overexposure such as premature ageing, skin leathering and skin cancer. Studies show that most of the skin's damage occurs before the age of eighteen. It is vital therefore that children, in particular, develop SunSmart habits early in life. The programme is presented in government and private pre and primary schools, middle and senior schools reaching children 4-16yrs. The Summer Camp Accreditation programme aims to provide those caring for Bermuda's youth during peak UV periods with the tools and understanding to prevent overexposure.

Smoking is the leading cause of premature, preventable death. It harms nearly every organ and organ system in the body and diminishes a person's overall health, causing cancers of the lung, oesophagus, larynx, mouth, throat, kidney, bladder, liver, pancreas and stomach, to name a few.

After a two year hiatus, the LungSmart programme has been redeveloped in collaboration with Open Airways. The programme will relaunch in the local school system in 2019, targeting children ages 10-12yrs. The aim is to use an interactive presentation on the dangers of cigarettes and tobacco use so that they can make informed decisions.

### Preventing a cancer diagnosis is the most surefire way to survive it. One of the most

Preventing a cancer diagnosis is the most surefire way to survive it. One of the most overlooked components of cancer prevention is the impact of lifestyle choices. These include diet, exercise, and choosing to vaccinate against HPV. It is essential for the Centre to share valuable information and keep it simple so that people take action.

One of the biggest challenges facing cancer prevention education is establishing a base of knowledge and understanding with the community. Our programmes are designed to open lines of dialogue for people to learn and ask questions.

# Financial Report

### Financial Report of 2018

The Centre ended 2018 in a stronger financial position as reflected in the financial summary, which shows net assets grew by \$1.7 million (or 33%) and net income by 32% (or \$408k). The year ended December 31, 2018, marked the first full fiscal year of operations for the Radiation Therapy (RT) unit, which reported only seven months of results in 2017.

Cash from operations allowed the Centre to pay down \$2 million of the \$3.5 million bank loan outstanding at the end of 2017. Additionally, improved billing and collection for RT insurance claims resulted in a notable decrease in accounts receivable relative to total service revenues.

With comparatively minimal capital investment in 2018 vs 2017, the Centre used increases in cash balances to internally restrict \$1.5m by year end in an effort to eliminate the outstanding bank debt in 2019.

Moving forward, the Centre is challenged with active management of its finances in the context of i) increase of un/under-insured patients ii) local health financing reforms, iii) evolving best practices in cancer prevention, detection and treatment and iv) local and global trends in population demographics, cancer incidence and overall healthcare.






